**Liturgy of the Word #9-The Creed (continued)**

"But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel other than the one that we preached to you, let that one be accursed." Galatians 1:8 NAB

Through the ages, the Creed has been known as the "symbolon fidei", or the "symbol of faith." The reason it was called this was because in war a "symbolon" was a small token which a general would give to a messenger so that the recipient of the message would know that it was truly from the general. In the same way, the Creed acts as a "symbolon" that would show that a person was truly a Christian; it 'authenticated' a person's Christian faith. In a way, our identity as Christian is tied to the Creed itself. And so, every Sunday, we as a Church reaffirm what we believe, join in the ages long profession of the Catholic faith.
