Eucharistic Revival, Introduction to the Mass: Eucharistic Prayer #4- The Eucharistic Actions

“While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, ‘Take and eat; this is my body.’” Matthew 26:26 NIV

At the Last Supper, Christ did four things: He took the bread, He blessed it/gave thanks, He broke it, and He gave it to His disciples. The Priest will say these words at every Mass right before the Words of Institution—a reminder that Christ is the one acting. However, while the words are said, these actions are also done: in the offertory the bread is taken by Christ, in the Eucharistic Prayer He blesses it and changes it into His own body, in the fraction rite He breaks the host in two reminding us of His death, and during the distribution of communion gives His body to us. As such, the entirety of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is a recapitulation of the actions of Christ at the Last Supper. Some commentators also argue that what happens to the bread that is offered also happens to the congregation.

“There is such a wide spectrum of issues involving the protection of human life and the promotion of human dignity. Good people frequently disagree on which problems to address, which policies to adopt and how best to apply them. But for citizens and elected officials alike, the basic principle is simple: We must begin with a commitment never to intentionally kill, or collude in the killing, of any innocent human life, no matter how broken, unformed, disabled or desperate that life may seem. In other words, the choice of certain ways of acting is always and radically incompatible with the love of God and the dignity of the human person created in His image.”

“Hay una gran gama de asuntos que tocan a la protección de la vida humana y a la promoción de la dignidad humana. La gente bien intencionada, con frecuencia, no está de acuerdo con los problemas que hay que resolver, cuáles normas se deben adoptar y la mejor manera de aplicarlas. Tanto para los ciudadanos como para las autoridades electas, el principio básico es simple: Debemos empezar con el compromiso de nunca matar intencionalmente, ni participar en la matanza de cualquier vida humana inocente, no importa lo defectuosa, mal formada, minusválida o desesperada que parezca. En otras palabras, la opción de cierta manera de actuar es siempre y radicalmente incompatible con el amor de Dios y la dignidad de la persona creada a Su imagen.”
