- 9. In AD 1095 Pope Urban II called for the **FIRST CRUSADE** to free the holy places of the East from **MOSLEM** control and assist Eastern Christians who were suffering under Islamic rule.
- 10. To stop political leaders from controlling the Catholic Church, the **CONCORDAT OF WORMS** in AD 1122 decreed that bishops and abbots would be elected according to the laws of the Church not by civil rulers. The Church endowed them with their **RING AND STAFF** and consecrated them.
- 11. In 1116, a monk named Bernard founded a **CISTERCIAN** order at Clairvaux. 600 more monasteries were founded influencing spiritual renewal.
- 12. In the 12th century, a Camaldolese monk named Gratian organized Catholic teaching and laws and created **CANON LAW**.
- 13. In 1215 Pope **INNOCENT III** called the Fourth Lateran Council to **REFORM** the Church. He also approved the new orders founded by St. Francis of Assisi and St. Dominic.
- 14. **SPIRITUAL RENEWAL** in the 13th century was greatly influenced by the Franciscans and Dominicans who converted heretics and corrected doctrinal error. Unfortunately, the Church was growing **WEALTHY**, and the clergy corrupt.
- 15. Popes being chosen by **EMPERORS** or powerful families resulted in corruption in the Church from the top on down. In 1059, Pope Nicholas II proclaimed that future popes would be elected by **CARDINALS** alone.
